Business Arising

- BYOD: The Professional education continues and there were 800 teachers from throughout the district at a whole day training on technology. After P&C suggestion, the team is happy for unwanted devices to be donated as long as they were less than 4 years old. There was an agreement for a trial of about 40 small computer lockers to gauge student interest. The maths textbooks are being well utilised and there need only be one book purchased per family in the case of multiple siblings in the same year.

	School Pride Awarded by any staff member to students who - respect their environment, correctly use school property, and consistently follow school rules and for helping staff members. School Representation

Awarded by the organising teacher to any student who represents the school in sporting teams, leadership activities, academic competitions and cultural events.

Higher Representation

Awarded by any staff member to students who have gained selection at a Western, State or Australian level for any endorsed Public School activity.

PBL Focus Reward

Awarded by any staff member to students observed following the PBL focus for the fortnight/month.

Responsible, Safe, Learner

Awarded by a classroom teacher to students who - arrive to class on time, bring correct equipment, attempt all set tasks, follows instructions and is respectful to others.

Minimum HSC Standards and Resources

In the lead up to this year's NAPLAN tests, the department will be providing information to school so that every Year 9 student and parent has accurate information about the NSW Government's implementation of a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy for the HSC from 2020. In particular, the main messages are -

- ✓ The HSC minimum standard is being introduced to help ensure that students leave school with the basic literacy
 and numeracy skills fundamental for life after school.
- ✓ NAPLAN is a chance to check a student's progress towards the HSC minimum standard or, for more advanced students, prequalify for the HSC minimum standard with Band 8s or higher.
- Most students will demonstrate the minimum standard by passing online reading, writing and numeracy tests in the lead up to Year 12.
- ✓ Year 9 students have three more years of learning before the HSC.

State of Origin Excursion

Bathurst High School have ordered 225 tickets to the second State of Origin game at ANZ Stadium held on Wednesday 21st June 2017. Around 290 students have expressed an interest in attending through year assemblies and the front office. At a meeting next week, notes are been distributed early next week and around 12 staff will attend the excursion that leaves around lunchtime and returns approximately 1.00am on Thursday morning 22nd June 2017.



Outstanding ANZAC Representation

Many students from Denison College attended Anzac Services on Tuesday 25th April 2017 as we paid our respects and honoured the memory of the gallant men and women who sacrificed their lives in service to our country. 






Tell Them From Me Surveys

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Discussion from Principal's report

Ken mentioned he has initiated a raffle to support Ryan Peacock, Captain of the NSW Combined High School Cricket Team to meet the costs of going on their tour of the United Kingdom later this year.

Denison College Principal's Report

Craig is currently in Sydney at department meetings.

Ken reported the college is moving towards aligning meeting structures between the two campuses as a way of facilitating collaboration.

General Business:

- Lots of positive feedback from students and parents regarding the Ancient History excursion to Greece and Italy during the holidays. Ken will pass the congratulations on and informed us there are several more overseas excursions in the planning.
- A query regarding Yr 12 study rooms. There are no specific rooms, due to restricted space but there are several areas allocated. The top area in the library and other areas where staff are also available to mentor senior students.
- Lack of space throughout the school continues to be an issue, so much so a whole school assembly could not be scheduled until week 5.
 - Maths tutoring after school Wednesdays has had a huge increase in numbers attending.
- The athletics carnival was not promoted as much as the swimming carnival at the school because attendance traditionally is very high. Ken will however be reviewing many functions on the school calendar as he settles into his role.

Business Without Notice:

• Kent and Dianne McNab provided feedback to the meeting regarding the progress on the Mitre/Suttor and Lambert street proposed roundabout. There were 3750 signatures on the petition Mr & Mrs McNab took to the April council meeting. Constructing the roundabout was part of the Councils draft budget submission. However it going ahead relies on the council receiving Black Spot funding from the Federal Government. At the Council's June meeting the budget will be confirmed. Mr McNab suggested writing letters to the Editor of

- the Advocate as a way to keep the issue in the spotlight.
- Parent query regarding the tendency for many assessments to fall due around the same time. Ken agreed and explained that the assessment processes are being looked at as a cross campus collaboration. This will be in conjunction with mandated changes in the Year 11 preliminary courses which requires assessments to be reduced from the current 7 to 3.
