From the Principal's Desk



New Bell Times in 2018

At the end of 2017 our students, staff and the P&C reviewed our existing bell times to solve a variety of issues such as students missing school buses, timing for meetings and teaching conditions for our staff. A decision was made to reduce roll call by 10 mins each day and divert this time into the periods across the school week. School now finishes 5 minutes earlier on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday at 3.20pm. Wednesdays now finish 10 minutes later at 3.00pm. The bell times are now operational and have been communicated to the bus companies and members of the school learning community.

All students and parents need to be aware of the procedures for students who are late to school at the start of the day. In 2018, there will be a considerable push to improve our overall attendance figures using the new welfare structures and Year Advisors. As part of this procedure, the senior executive will also focus on students who are repeatedly late to school with a reason and the others who attend late without a reason. The following procedures have been explained to students at school assemblies. If there are any questions about this procedure, please contact the senior executive.

Teachers mark the roll each morning – Roll Call 8.55am to 9.05am

Mark on millennium the time for students who arrive late to roll call.

Teachers will read the student notices in roll call at 9.00am.

Students who arrive after 9.05am and miss the official roll call must attend the front office to sign in and receive a class entrance pass.

Students who fail to submit a note or justifiable reason for their lateness will be asked to catch up this time during one of the student breaks. Parents can phone in their child's late reason if there is inadequate time to write a late note.

Year 7 to 10 Common Scale Assessment Grading

After ongoing consultation with executive throughout 2017, it was decided to have a consistent marking guideline for all assessment tasks across the school in all key-learning areas from Year 7 to Year 10. Parents and students can be confident that an **A Grade** in English means the same mark standard as an **A Grade** in PD/H/PE or Science. The following cut offs will be checked for all assessment tasks in 2018.

Enrolment Procedures Year 7 2019

Total enrolment for the college is approaching 2000 students. Both campuses will be applying the Department of Education's enrolment policy more rigorously for students seeking enrolment from 2019. Students are entitled to apply for enrolment at their local campus, determined by their place of residence. Families wishing to be considered for enrolment at their non-local campus will need to complete an Expression of Interest (Section C of the enrolment form) and return it to the campus that you wish to enrol your child at by 16 March 2018. On Wednesday March 7, 2018 Central West Women's Health Centre (CWWHC) is hosting two workshops presented by the Butterfly Foundation. **Great Expectations** for young women aged 14 to 18 years will run from 4pm to 5.30pm, and **Body Confident Children** & **Teens** for parents and carers will run from 6pm to 7.30pm.

Great Expectations focuses on some of the individual and environmental factors that place pressure and unrealistic expectations on us to look and be a certain way. It aims to build resilience and explore vital topics such as self/body esteem, confidence and the issues, including social media, that can impact this, as well as promoting healthy behaviours, relationships, and help seeking.

Body Confident Children & **Teens** is an interactive presentation that aims to equip parents/carers with the knowledge, information, and tips to help understand and promote positive body image in the home.
