## Bathurst High Campus introduces the School Stream online communication App

#### What is School Stream?

Our custom form builder with sign feature can even accept mobile payments using Paypal or Stripe. School Stream also offers instant in-app translation in over 100 different languages for users whose first language is not English.



### Create multiple profiles

One of the unique benefits of School Stream is that you can create multiple profiles within the one app. For example, a school may wish to have a profile dedicated to the junior campus, one for the senior campus and one for school sports. Parents can simply load the profiles that are relevant and switch between profiles within the one app.

In the next few weeks, Bathurst High Campus will introduce the Bathurst High School branded School Stream app to our students and parents. Our schools media team are currently in training to build the platform, which will assist our parents with all school communication, information notes and other correspondence. After a review of results, a number of students performed exceptionally well across a number of events. Kane Simmons performed exceptionally well in field events throughout the day. He placed first in the following events – High Jump - 1.70m, Long Jump - 5.22m, Discus - 35.12m, Shotput - 12.15m, Javelin - 39.32m.

Breanna Fisk impressed everyone by entering all events and she has subsequently qualified for the regional trials in her category classification; 100m - 19.64s, Discus - 14.78m, Shotput - 6m, 800m - 5.23mins, Javelin - 8.08m. Hayley Davis and Paige Lowe kept the 13 Girls age group very interesting with both having a handful of 1st and 2nd places and will be fighting it out for age champion. Hayley placed in 200m - 30.69s, discus - 20.02m, high jump - 1.35m, long jump - 3.67m, 100m - 13.93, javelin - 16.78m and 400m - 1:19.72. Paige placed in 100m - 13.72m, high jump - 1.35m, 400m - 1:12.62, 200m - 29.10s, long jump - 3.84m and shotput - 8.04m.

Zen Clark performed outstandingly across all events throughout the day, placing in all of his events. Zen jumped an impressive 180cm and finished his 100m sprint in 11.72s. Other events included 200m - 23.4s, 400m - 53.88s, discus - 25.66m, long jump - 5.85m and shotput - 11.90m.

Ella Davis and Ruby Clark fought hard for wins in the 16 girls! Both girls achieving three 1st places and two 2nds. Ruby came first in long jump - 3.74m, high jump – 140cm and javelin - 13.17m and second in discus -16.31m and 100m.

Ella came first in 100m - 13.24s, 200m and 400m and second in long jump - 3.62m and javelin.

Other exceptional results to mention – Nash Hutchings (15 boys) 1st place discus throw, travelling an impressive 30.84m. Ryan Rooke and Damian Mays (Opens boys), who were competitive in track events. Congratulations to all involved on the day. Well done, everyone.

## Sailing Success for School Captain -Niamh McAdam

School Captain Niamh McAdam competed in the Combined High Schools Sailing Championships held at Belmont on Lake Macquarie in the April school holidays. Niamh is skipper of a Nacra 5.8m (19 Ft) racing catamaran and teamed up with crew Matthew Hatton from Redcliffe State High School in Queensland. Both sailors have extensive experience at the state and national level and they proved to be a formidable team. The pair coming 1st in the multihull division of the 52nd NSW CHS Sailing Championship and 2nd (equal first on points, but 2nd on a count back) in the multihull division of 40th Australian Secondary Schools Sailing Championship and the 43rd NSW Secondary Schools Sailing Championship. Niamh has been racing sailing boats since she was 8 in a variety of classes and is currently the youngest and only female skipper in the Nacra 5.8 class sailing at the national level.

## **College Principal's Report**



### **College Development Day**

Approximately 185 teachers and School Learning Support Officers (SLSOs) attended the Term 2 College Development Day held at the Kelso High

Campus on Monday 30th April. A team of key staff from both campuses have worked throughout the last term bringing together a high quality day on the theme of Every Student Every School. 11 workshops led by College staff were highly-rated in supporting staff to differentiate learning, develop effective class profiles, embed student learning and support plans in everyday practice and make effective use of non-teaching staff in classrooms.

The College Development Days are held at least once each year and serve to provide effective and high quality professional learning for staff and to facilitate collaborations across the college.

Combined College Management Teams Mr Barwick, Mr Sloan and I meet every Tuesday morning as the College Management Group (CMG) to discuss high level strategy and collaborations impacting on both campuses of the college. We are joined in these meetings by Mrs Murphy, the College Deputy. Tuesday 1st May saw an extended CMG meeting with not just the three principals, but also the six deputy principals discussing a range of issues impacting on students across both campuses. Topics included monitoring of student work and NESA requirements for course completion; major events planned for this term; the professional learning program for senior executive staff and a proposed college curriculum review.

These extended management meetings will take place three times each term and will allow for closer coordination of activities across the college.

We are also in the process of establishing a more regular program of professional learning for the combined executive of both campuses. We have a combined leadership team of around 35 Head Teachers, Deputy

Principals and Principals. This is a large team and gives us enormous capacity to draw upon a wide range of skills from our experienced leaders. The next planned activity on 25th June will be introducing the entire executive to SCOUT – a tool which brings together a wide range of student and school data which head teachers will be able to use to inform their faculty planning.
